

### PAINT DROP-OFF



Monroe's Recycling Center accepts paint drop-off by Monroe residents during normal operating hours. We accept latex, water and oil based paints, stains, varnishes, lacquers, thinners, paint aerosols, and cans with paint in them. If paint is dried up, please dispose in the trash.

Middlesex County residents may drop-off on the 3rd Saturday of each month 8:30a.m. – 11:30a.m.

- USED MOTOR OIL
- COOKING OIL



**NOTE: No contractors, landscapers or businesses are permitted to make drop-offs at the Recycling Center. Proof of residency per vehicle is required.**

Foam Cycle is a foam packaging (aka Styrofoam) collection, densifying, and recycling system that we have available to residents at the Recycling Center.

## CENTER FOR HARD TO RECYCLE MATERIAL

## WHAT WE ACCEPT

For re-wear, re-use, and recycling, we accept the following items in any condition for all ages and genders so long as they are clean, dry, and odorless. Everything should be kept dry in a closed, plastic bag. Recycling your clothes shouldn't be hard, we're here to help!

### FOOTWEAR

Shoes, Heels, Flats, Sandals,  
Flip Flops, Boots(all varieties), Sneakers,  
Cleats, Slippers

### ACCESSORIES

Hats, Bags(pocketbooks, backpacks,  
duffle bags, totes), Belts, Gloves, Ties,  
Scarves, Bathrobes, Jewelry

### OTHER

Luggage, Sports Jerseys,  
Stuffed animals

### CLOTHING

Tops(t-shirts, blouses, shirts, tank tops),  
Sweaters, Dresses, Outerwear(coats,  
jackets, blazers), Bottoms(pants,  
slacks, jeans, sweatpants, skirts,  
shorts), Suits, Pajamas, Intimates(slips,  
bras, underwear, socks), Baby clothing

### LINENS

Sheets/Pillowcases, Blankets,  
Comforters, Curtains/Drapes, Aprons,  
Dish cloths, Cloth napkins, Table linens,  
Quilts

cargo area or truck bed, easily accessible to our staff, who will remove it from your vehicle.


# Bulk Waste Curbside Pick-Up

THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS OFFERS A **FREE** ONCE-A-YEAR BULK WASTE CURBSIDE PICK-UP. THIS PICK UP IS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY FROM APRIL THROUGH THE END OF OCTOBER (*subject to availability*).

## GUIDELINES FOR CURBSIDE PICK-UP

- Limited to approximately one pick-up truck load.
- No hazardous materials-chemicals, paint, pesticides.
- No tires, utility poles, railroad ties, construction debris.
- No stumps, sod, dirt, concrete, asphalt, or stones.
- No food. Pallets are limited to three.
- Wrap mattresses/box springs in plastic.
- Separate your piles with metal/electronics in one pile, the rest of items in another.
- Lumber must have nails removed or bent over.
- Refrigerators and freezers must have the doors removed (State Law 2C:43-1).
- No recyclables such as cardboard, newspaper, bottles/cans, etc.



## WHITE GOODS APPLIANCE PICK-UP

Appliance pick-up is available throughout the year, subject to weather conditions. Appliances include refrigerator, oven, dishwasher, washer, and/or dryer.


Schedule your appointment with the **Department of Public Works** at **732-656-4575**. Once scheduled, you will place your appliance at the curb the night before your scheduled date.

Drop them off...

The effort to stop the abuse and diversion of prescription drugs begins at home and must include the opportunity for New Jersey consumers to dispose of their unused medications safely and securely at any time throughout the year.

With New Jersey's Project Medicine Drop (NJPMD), we are placing secured drop boxes in the Monroe Township Police Department. Consumers from anywhere in New Jersey can visit the boxes seven days a week, to drop off unneeded and expired medications and keep them away from those at risk of abusing them.

The drop boxes accept solid pharmaceuticals such as pills, capsules, patches, inhalers, and pet medications. They cannot accept syringes or liquids.

## SAFE SYRINGE PROGRAM

Many hospitals in and around the County participate in the New Jersey Hospital Association's Safe Syringe Program. Hospitals provide sharps containers to the home generator that the generator returns to the hospital when full. Contact the hospitals listed below for further information.

Note: Under no circumstances should needles ever be put in any type of container and placed out for recycling collection. This is very hazardous to recycling center employees.

## STORMWATER POLLUTION

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings, etc. all end up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we are all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.



## CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR PET

- Pet owners are required to pick up and properly dispose of the pet waste.
- Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.
- Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.
- Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.



# New Jersey CLEAN COMMUNITIES



New Jersey Clean Communities is a statewide, comprehensive litter abatement program created by the passage of the Clean Communities Act in 1986. The Act Provides a funding source for the program by placing a tax on fifteen categories of businesses that may produce litter-generated products.
